8. Children's Centre

Mr Eric Briggs advised that he had attended an open meeting recently held at the Heysham Youth & Community Centre and he was generally pleased with the way the plans are progressing.

The approved plans will improve the existing site around Heysham Youth & Community Centre with a Sports Hall facility to the rear and a secure fence that will improve the security as it will go all the way round the building.

The internal work to the building will ensure better facilities and should not interfere with the existing running of the building.

9. A.O.B

Mr Paul Mallett has been appointed onto the Registrar Committee for the General Dental Council which will help us keep in touch with developments in the local area with regard to dental provision.

Mr Brian Reeve recently attended a PACT meeting and brought details of a Teen Shelter which has been discussed as a possible solution to address the lack of meeting places for local teenagers.

It was agreed that Mitchells could purchase the 'old' marquee for £50
