3. Matters arising from the minutes 23rd September 2009

9. Mossgate

The Chairman read out his letter of response to a letter from a Mr Harrison that had been featured in The Visitor regarding the development.

‘I just need to clarify a couple of points from the letter in The Visitor this week from Mr Harrison.

Mr Harrison seems to think that this development is HNC’s project totally wrong, HNC are supporting this application after requests from Mossgate residents as to where the roof tax money is going to be spent and when, also the committee feel that Heysham needs this facility to improve health care and sporting facilities.

16 years ago in the Arndale Centre there was a 3 day presentation on the Mossgate Development and since then this project has always continued to move forward, at times significantly backwards, but this land has since planning consent was given always going to be developed. If you bought your house within that time scale your solicitor should have picked this up on a search.

Unfortunately HNC have no control over information given to them, we only try to keep residents aware and can only relay this information as received and try to clarify any points raised as we did when consulting with the bowlers.

HNC got an answer for the residents of Douglas Drive who wanted to but land not the answer they would have liked that is possibly why we have this discontent
