A sand pit cover, in an outdoor play area, at a nursery, on Rothesay Road, Heysham, was damaged between 10:00 27/02/2010 and 11:00 27/02/2010. Other toys in the area were also disturbed but not damaged. The offender/s made off undetected.

The bonnet of a car, parked at The Wesley Methodist Church, Middleton Road, Heysham, was damaged by unknown offender/s. The offence was committed between 18:05 28/02/2010 and 20:45 28/02/2010. CSI evidence

was taken from the scene for examination.

An arrest was made shortly after criminal damage was reported at a property on Longlands Lane, Heysham at 00:05 on 05/03/2010. A half brick had been used to damage a circular leaded window.

The outer pane, of a double glazed window, at a property on Combermere Road, Heysham, was damaged between 23:00 05/03/2010 and 09:30 06/03/2010.

The rear window, of a vehicle, parked on Warren Grove, Heysham was damaged between 19:30 06/03/2010 and 20:00 06/03/2010.

A fencing panel at a property on Sugham Lane, Heysham, was damaged between 20:00 06/03/2010 and 08:00 07/03/2010.

Fuel with a total value of £800 was syphoned from three vehicles, at a haulage yard in Heysham, between 20:00 06/03/2010 and 08:00 07/03/2010.

Medication, including prescribed drugs, was taken from a vehicle parked on Barrows Lane, Heysham, between 17:00 05/03/2010 and 16:00 08/03/2010.

Flat screen televisions have been taken in two separate burglaries at a leisure site in Heysham. CSI evidence has been obtained from one of the scenes of crime.

Damage was caused between 18:00 16/03/2010 and 07:15 17/03/2010 when offender/s attempted to gain access to portakabins on the Mossgate Park Development site. CSI evidence was left at the scene.

A wing mirror was damaged on a vehicle parked on Warren Grove, Heysham. The offence was committed between 19:00 20/03/2010 and 11:30 21/03/2010.

A wing mirror was damaged on a vehicle parked on Sugham Lane, Heysham. The offence was committed between 19:30 20/03/2010 and 11:00 21/03/2010.

Heysham Golf Club was targetted between 19:30 21/03/2010 and 23:15 21/03/2010. A double glazed window and a coffee table were damaged in an attempt to remove the safe. However, it appears they were disturbed and left empty handed.

A flat screen TV was taken during a burglary at a property on Kingsway, Heysham. The offence was committed between 16:00 23/03/2010 and 22:30 23/03/2010. An object was used to break a UVPC window to gain access.

Damage to a mains electric cable was caused during an attempted break in at a business premises on Middleton Business Park. The offence was committed at 18:45 on 21/03/2010.

A cash box containing a sum of money, was taken during a burglary at a premises on Middleton Business Park. The offence was committed between 00:00 25/03/2010 and 00:40 25/03/2010. The offender gained access by smashing a small window.

The nearside window of a vehicle parked on Middleton Road, Heysham was damaged between 21:00 and 21:30 25/03/2010. The offender made off undetected.

A plant vehicle on the Mossgate development project was damaged between 17:00 25/03/2010 and 07:00 26/03/2010.

A fence panel, at a property on Heysham Hall Grove, was damaged at 22:35 26/03/2010.

A window on a vehicle parked on Rothesay Road, Heysham was damaged between 23:00 26/03/2010 and 10:30 27/03/2010.

A garage door, at a property on Heysham Hall Grove was damaged

between 16:00 26/03/2010 and 08:00 27/03/2010.

Damage to two vehicles parked on Bailey Lane, Heysham, occurred between 21:30 27/03/2010 and 11:30 28/03/2010.

Damage to a fishing boat, parked outside the owners residence, on Middleton Road, Heysham, occurred between 15/03/2010 and 27/03/2010.

The bus shelter in Heysham Village was damaged at 23:10 on 27/03/2010.

Plant machinery was taken during burglaries at a building development on Redshank Drive and Mossgate Walk Heysham. The offences were committed between 16:00 26/03/2010 and 08:00 29/03/2010.

This Month's Top Five

1. Knife-point robbery victim gets jail apology from her attacker. *(Lancaster's offender management unit)*

As part of a restorative justice project, a restaurant manager was able to receive an apology after visiting her attacker, an 18-year-old at Lancaster Farms, where he is serving time after leaving her bloodied and bruised following a vicious street robbery.

2. Pedal power helps catch criminals in Wyre *(Thornton, Poulton and Cleveleys' neighbourhood police teams)*

The towns' NPTs have used money seized from criminals under the Proceeds of Crime Act (POCA) to buy new bicycles and equipment that allows them to cover more ground while out on patrol.

3. Parent gives web advice after teacher jailed *(Lancaster public protection unit)*

The mother of a teenager who was persuaded to send provocative pictures to her teacher offered advice to parents about keeping their children safe on-line after Goy was jailed for 26 weeks.

4. **Officers work with pubs to warn drinkers over new danger drug (*Lancaster neighbourhood police team*)**

Members of Lancaster's PubWatch scheme have joined together with the NPT to display posters warning customers about the dangers of taking 'Bubble.'

5. **Armed robber nailed by DNA sample in hat (*Lancaster CID*)**

An armed robber was jailed for 12 years after a security guard plucked his hat – containing his DNA – from his head during a cash in transit raid in Lancaster in 2008.
