**Criminal damage to vehicles** was reported to have taken place overnight on 31/8/10 - 01/09/10 when tyres on three vehicles were slashed. The incidents occurred on Sycamore Gardens, Trumacar Lane and Peel Ave.

Windows on a vehicle on Barrows Lane, Heysham were damaged overnight 5-6/09/10.

All four tyres on a vehicle parked on Douglas Drive, Heysham, were slashed between 15-16/09/10.

An electric aerial on a vehicle parked on Heysham Mossgate Road was damaged during daylight hours, 22/09/10.

A rear and side window parked on Delamere Avenue, Heysham were damaged between 14:30 and 21:00 21/09/10.

Two vehicles in Montrose Crescent, Heysham, were damaged between 19:30 and 22:05 on 22/09/10.

A vehicle on Main Street, Heysham was damaged between 20:00 23/09/10 and 12:00 25/09/10.

The roof and bonnet of a car parked at St. James's Court, Heysham was damaged between 18:00 23/09/10 and 15:00 25/09/10.

## **Update on damage:**

**Suspects** have been interviewed in connection with a number of the damage incidents in Heysham during September.

**Burglaries** were reported to have occurred overnight 31/08/10 – 01/09/10, when after accessing a garage on School Road, Heysham, ladders were disturbed which caused a noise and the offenders made off undetected.

An attempted burglary at St. Peter's School, Heysham, overnight 4-5/09/10, resulted in damaged being caused to two skylights.

Cash and jewellery were taken in a burglary on Sycamore Gardens, Heysham, during the evening of 11/9/2010.

Three bicycles, with a total value of almost £1500 were taken during a burglary on a garage at a residence on Thistle Break, Heysham. The incident occurred between 22:30 and 00:10 29-30/09/10.

**Criminal damage to property** was reported to have taken place at; The Old Hall Inn, where a window was smashed on 31/8/10, a property on Combermere Road where a window was smashed between 01:30 and 09:30 on 01/09/10, at a property on Heysham Park at 19:30hrs where an ornamental garden light was smashed.

The public toilets in Heysham Village were targeted during daylight hours of 06/08/10 causing damage to the gents.

Windows at St. Peter's School on School Road were damaged by ammunition from a pellet gun between 30/08/10 and 06/09/10.

Graffiti was scrawled on a bus stop on Sugham Lane, Heysham, between 15:00 05/09/10 and 11:00 on 06/09/10.

A satellite dish at Heysham Cricket Club was damaged between 23:00 09/09/10 and 17:00 10/09/10.

A security light at a property on Heysham Park was damaged between 15:00 and 23:00 09/09/10.

The bus stop on Middleton Road, Heysham was damaged at 18:30 on 19/09/10.

The perimeter fencing at the electricity sub station at Glen View Crescent, Heysham was damaged between 16-17/09/10.

Garage windows at a residence on Cyprus Road, Heysham, were damaged between 18:00 and 19:30 on 22/09/10.

### **Theft of property.**

A bicycle was taken from a property on Bailey Lane, Heysham, overnight 02-03/09/10.

A Marin mountain bike was taken during a burglary of a garage at a property on Dunlin Avenue, Heysham, overnight 25-26/09/10.

Three bicycles, with a total value of almost £1500 were taken during a burglary on a garage at a residence on Thistle Break, Heysham. The incident

occurred between 22:30 and 00:10 29-30/09/10.

A bicycle was taken from the cycle carrier on the rear of a car parked on Mossgate Walk, Heysham. The incident occurred overnight 27-28/09/10.

A sat nav was taken from a car parked on Eardley Road, Heysham, Between 13/09/2010 and 28/09/2010

### **Ring thief apologises to pensioner. (Lancaster)**

A restorative justice project which saw a convicted burglar apologise to his victim at her home. The officers asked various questions of both the victim and the offender and their answers helped to write the press release.

### **Lancaster Farms drug trio jailed.**

Three men who tried to throw drugs over the prison wall received a substantial jail sentence.

### **Mystery of the treasure chest.**

Two cases stuffed with jewellery were left under the Priory's pews two years ago. Attempts are still being made to find it's rightful owner. Despite being featured quite heavily in the papers and on Radio Lancs the jewellery remains unclaimed.

### **Howzat! Cricket club to benefit from criminals' cash.**

Money confiscated under the proceeds of crime act was used to by new

shutters for Bare cricket club, which was repeatedly targeted by burglars last summer.

### **Man jailed after call of nature finally reveals drugs stash.**

Anthony Mason didn't go to the toilet for 13 days in order to keep his drugs hidden (in a very delicate place!) Officers were patient and he was jailed for five years. Mason was from Liverpool.

### **Special sergeant receives special award.**

Special sergeant Peter Corke received an award to honour his work on improving safety on public transport.

### **Pub drug dealers jailed.**

Three men, were jailed for a total of 12 years after officers were able to show they had been dealing drugs from a Lancaster pub.

### **Lancaster man given ASBO.**

Arrested during the recent Bespoke raids he has been banned from Ryelands after a campaign of harassment against residents. This will also feature in a Behind Bars ASBO leaflet that will be distributed amongst the community.
