You said:

Anti social behaviour and damage in the area of Heysham Barrows and Heysham Village.

We did:

'Operation Niggle' has been running in these areas over the last month. The team has been working alongside The Fire Service and The National Trust to combat issues raised by local residents about anti social behaviour. Alcohol has been seized, Youth Referral Forms (YRF's) have been issued and youths were spoken to and advised about their actions in these areas. As a result the team will liaise and work closely with the National Trust.

A look at our recent beat area logs:

Burglaries

An attempt was made to enter the co-op shop on Heysham Road, Heysham at 02:20 17/08/2011 An Unknown offender has approached locked and secure shop and caused damage to the glass front door. They have then caused damage to a

reinforced window further down having thrown a rock twice at the window. The offender has then made up Heysham Road towards the port.

Between 03:00 28/08/2011 and 08:00 28/08/2011 a garage door on a property on Longlands Lane, Heysham was forced. Once inside the offender/s made a tidy search and a number of items were taken including; a mens Marin Mountain bike and power tools. Total value of items taken is over £3000. Possible CSI evidence is being examined.

Criminal Damage

A stone was thrown at a bus travelling along Sugham Lane, Heysham at 21:20 10/08/2011 causing damage estimated at £300.

Village toilets were damaged – fibre glass flashing was taken from the roof.

Lea Lane – a flat window was damaged – probably caused by a stone.

A gate at a property was damaged on Middleton Road.

Auto Crime

A number plate was removed from a motorcycle parked in the vicinity of Penrod Way - Smithy Lane area of Heysham . The incident occurred Between 20:30 02/08/2011 and 22:15 02/08/2011.

A quantity of fuel was siphoned from a vehicle parked in a compound of a

haulage company in Heysham between 17:30 01/08/2011 and 06:30 02/08/2011.

A attempt was made to siphon fuel from a vehicle parked in the compound of a haulage company in Heysham at 00:15 06/08/2011. The offender was disturbed and made off undetected.

Four vehicles on Kingsway, Heysham were damaged overnight 12/13th August.

A mobile phone was taken from an insecure car on Willowfield Road, Heysham Between 19:00 19/08/2011 and 11:30 20/08/2011.

A battery was taken from a motorcycle parked outside a property on Combermere Road, Heysham between 20/08/2011 and 12:00 21/08/2011.

Anti-social behaviour

Two reports of camping on The Barrows. (same incident).

One report of play park damage. No damage found.

Eighteen other incidents, mainly relating to Tarnbrook flats; insecure doors, hallways etc. (PACT priority for September).

Bus route No 12

A couple of incidents have occurred where buses have struck the wing mirrors of cars parked on Heysham Mossgate Road, causing damage. It may occur that the driver is unaware of the incident and therefore does not stop to give his details. If this is the
